FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In its twelve years of service, CAIR-Chicago has handled over **3,800 legal cases** of anti-Muslim discrimination, negotiated over **\$1.3 million** directly to clients of resolved discrimination cases, conducted over **1,200 mainstream media interviews**, and graduated **589 interns**.

CAIR-Chicago continued its legacy of success over the course of 2015.

We were able to resolve key civil rights cases to the benefit of our clients **including citizenship delay** and **employment discrimination** cases. We continued with our landmark **Prison Project** advocating for the rights of Muslim inmates, and our **Political Asylum** project, serving mostly Syrians escaping certain persecution. Our trial attorneys won settlements for clients of discrimination in excess of \$75,000.

In 2014, our representatives were hosted dozens of times on networks such as CNN, FOX News, MSNBC, Al Hurra, Al Jazeera, RT, France24, ABC CBS, NBC, ABC, WGN and NPR among others; as well as the Chicago Tribune, the Daily Herald, the Chicago Sun-Times, and the Wall Street Journal among other newspapers and websites. In each case, We sought to bring a lucid Muslim perspective on pressing issues putting out the raw facts

on the American Muslim community and the **values of our democracy.**

Our communications department continued to trail blaze, launching the first "cartooning internship" of its kind at any non-profit, in order to create and publish **political cartoons** in-house. We forayed heavily into strategic deployment of **social media tools**; for example, our Buzzfeed quiz garnered 50,000 views and three of our memes went viral on Facebook and Twitter. This year, we gave a **design overhaul** to our website and designed a new mobile-friendly site (our 8th website redesign in 12 years).

Our Google News indexed flagship blog, the Chicago Monitor, continued to make splashes covering current affairs of import to the Muslim community and the American public that often get glossed over in the mainstream media. Over 100 unique columnists from among our staff and beyond are contributing writers. We are especially proud of the young talents whom we helped cultivate into empowered voices eloquently expressing themselves and their communities.

2015 witnessed heavy community engagement. Our staff gave guest lectures, keynote speeches, commencement speeches, and panel discussions at dozens of universities and public schools in Illinois and the Midwest. We also held dozens of workshops at mosques and Islamic schools.

This year, we also took our **government relations and civic engagement program** to the next level. For the first time in our chapter's history, we published voter education guides, legislative scorecards and referendum guides for the Chicago municipal elections. We co-sponsored a Chicago mayoral candidate form; and we recruited election judges, poll watchers and exit surveyors along with our partners, an effort that studies showed **boosted voter turnout** in areas that traditionally had low voter turnout.

We are taking the lead on behalf of Illinois Muslims in standing with our interfaith partners and immigrant communities to advocate for comprehensive immigration reform. And we continue to administer programs to our youth, including MYLS (Muslim Youth Leadership

Symposium) to ensure that they are impervious to radical ideologies as well as the effects of bullying and hatemongering.



2015 FINANCIAL SUMMARY



CIVIL RIGHTS DEPARTMENT

Throughout 2015, the Civil Rights Department of CAIR-Chicago continued its critical work of advocating against discrimination toward Muslims in America, litigating when necessary to fully protect their civil liberties. More than 400 complaints were reported to the Department just this year, exceeding the amount of complaints in any previous year during CAIR-Chicago's history. Litigation Director Kevin Vodak, Staff Attorney Rabya Khan, and Trial Attorney Phil Robertson maximized the department's limited resources to assist the local Muslim-American community in numerous areas, working with government officials, business leaders, and legal counsel to resolve both systemic and individual issues.

Cases investigated and pursued by the Department in 2015 included employment discrimination, immigration-related complaints, the denial of religious accommodations for driver's license applicants, FBI harassment, and school bullying. CAIR-Chicago's work in immigration cases included prosecuting dozens of delays in citizenship, work authorization, and green card applications, as well as the initial filing of a number of asylum applications and applications for Temporary Placement Status.

EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION

The Department handled a variety of employment discrimination cases in 2015 before the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), the Illinois Department of Human Rights (IDHR), and the Chicago Commission on Human Rights (CCHR). CAIR-Chicago brought an action along with the EEOC against National Tire and Battery for workplace discrimination against a Muslim man, resulting in a Consent Decree that awarded \$22,500.00 to the client and required NTB to conduct annual sensitivity training for its managers. Before the IDHR, CAIR-Chicago brought an action on behalf of a Muslim man who was verbally assaulted at a national department store by a security guard. The CCHR heard cases brought by CAIR-Chicago on behalf of a Muslim woman who was required to remove her hijab while teaching at a day care facility, a Muslim woman who was threatened by hate speech and retaliation by her Not-for-Profit employer. and a Muslim woman who was terminated at her position at a dentist's office for wearing her hijab at work. CAIR-Chicago also filed a charge with the EEOC on behalf of a Muslim woman who was subjected to regular and repeated verbal discrimination at work. Additionally, CAIR-Chicago brought suit against Advocate Health Systems on behalf of a Muslim woman who was denied accommodations for religious worship and was subjected to retaliatory treatment as a result of her ethnic origin and religion, and against a School District for the retaliatory discharge of a Muslim substitute teacher which resulted in a settlement award of more than \$25,000.00 for the client.

In March 2014, CAIR-Chicago started the Asylum Project. Due to the Syrian Civil War and continued strife in many Muslim countries, there continues to be an increasing number of Muslims seeking asylum in the United States. The Civil Rights Department currently has a dozen affirmative asylum applications pending before the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Service. The asylum clients (mostly from Syria and Egypt) include students, physicians, professors, and activists. As part of the Asylum Project, the Department also helps the asylees file their applications for temporary protected status (TPS) and employment authorization (EAD).

In addition, CAIR-Chicago has assisted a number of immigrants seeking Legal Permanent Residency status (Green Cards) and grants of citizenship whose applications have been delayed in processing or have not been acted upon in a reasonable time. CAIR-Chicago works with the U.S. Immigration Service administratively to determine where the application is in the process and what can be done to remove any remaining obstacles to citizenship, and files suit against the government when necessary to obtain relief for clients.

CIVIL RIGHTS ACCOMPLISHMENTS

CITIZENSHIP/PERMANENT RESIDENCY DELAY

• The Department has directly assisted more than 300 Muslim immigrants to become naturalized as U.S. citizens or to gain Legal Permanent Residency after facing extensive delays, and has advised more than 600 individuals on their immigration benefits applications.

DIRECT RESOURCE FOR VICTIMS

- CAIR-Chicago attorneys have handled over 3800 cases of anti-Muslim discrimination.
- In the past eight years, CAIR-Chicago has negotiated the payment of nearly \$1.3 million directly to clients from resolved discrimination cases.
- CAIR-Chicago has conducted sensitivity and diversity trainings to law enforcement officials, employees and managers of private businesses, faculty and administrators of public and private schools, and offenders of hate crimes.

FBI HARASSMENT

 More than 200 individuals have been advised by the Department in addressing contacts by FBI agents.

EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION

- The Department has advised more than 700 Muslim employees regarding their potential claims of employment discrimination.
- CAIR-Chicago has worked both locally and on a national level to improve EEOC policies and procedures to better address Muslim employees' charges of discrimination.

ZONING DENIALS

Beginning with the Irshad Learning Center, for which
the Department obtained judgment in its favor in
2013, CAIR-Chicago has represented mosques
facing zoning issues. That same year, CAIR-Chicago
filed suit against the City of Des Plaines for denying a
zoning map amendment that would have allowed the

American Islamic Center to build a new mosque for its growing membership. In October 2015, the Court allowed the U.S. Department of Justice to intervene in the matter in support of CAIR-Chicago and the Center's claims of religious discrimination against the City.

PRISON PROJECT

- The Department has provided more than 300 inmates with legal advice regarding their rights to religious accommodations.
- Beginning in 2012, the Department has coordinated volunteers to provide food donations to Chicago-area inmates during Eid celebrations.

TRAVEL FREE PROJECT

• The Department directly advises Muslim travelers who are delayed, detained, or interrogated by law enforcement officers, primarily due to their names being placed on watchlists by the Transportation and Security Administration (TSA) and other Federal agencies. Assistance has included filing Traveler Redress Inquiry Program (TRIP) complaints, issuing Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests, and working with government officials from the Federal Aviation Administration and the Department of Transportation to resolve the problems.

Tustice for HATE GRIMES The Department is routinely contacted by community members who have experienced hate crimes as a result of their religion. When a Muslim woman in a Chicago suburb was harassed by a

munity members who have experienced hate crimes as a result of their religion. When a Muslim woman in a Chicago suburb was harassed by a flyer posted in her neighborhood threatening her and her family, CAIR-Chicago worked with the Cook County State's Attorney's Office and the local police to investigate the matter and monitor the situation. When a Muslim woman received hate e-mails through her social media account, CAIR-Chicago worked with the company and the FBI to investigate the sources of the e-mails. When a Muslim student was bullied at school, CAIR-Chicago worked with the family, the school, and the student to develop an action plan so he could continue his studies there without further harassment.

RELIGIOUS ACCOMMODATION

In 2008, nearly 40 Muslim Somali workers at the JBS Swift plant, in Grand Island, Nebraska, were terminated after striking and petitioning the employer for prayer accommodations. The employer required them to pray only during their designated breaks, at times that were not consistent with scheduled prayer times. CAIR-Chicago and the EEOC brought suit in Nebraska District Court on behalf of the terminated workers who, in addition to their "failure to accommodate" claims, were also subjected to numerous incidents of individual discrimination by co-workers and company management. CAIR-Chicago and the EEOC continued to aggressively litigate the matter throughout 2015, including engaging in extensive discovery and defeating numerous motions to dismiss the case. It is set for trial in May 2016.

CIVIL RIGHTS IN YOUR COMMUNITY

On October 6, 2015, Phil Robertson, Rabya Khan, and Ahmed Rehab participated in a U.S. Department of Homeland Security mosque safety conference. The conference was called to address the recent rise in Islamophobic incidents directed at mosques and Muslim community centers, and was attended by the FBI, DHS, and a number of civic and religious leaders from around the country.

OUTREACH DEPARTMENT

The Outreach Department aims to educate and build bridges between Muslims and diverse communities in the greater Chicago metro region, establish partnerships with other civil rights and advocacy organizations, and bolster CAIR-Chicago's ability to serve it constituents in Chicago's Muslim communities. To this end, the Outreach Department leads CAIR-Chicago's youth leadership programs, internship and volunteer activist programs, interfaith and intercultural initiatives, and educational seminars.

Since CAIR began tracking hate incidents, 2015 was the worst year on record for Muslim Americans since 9/11—beginning with the infamous Chapel Hill massacre to backlash following the Islamophobic vitriol spewed on the presidential campaign trail with the Paris and San Bernardino terror attacks. Given this drastic rise in anti-Muslim sentiment coupled with reports of intimidation and violence, the questions and concerns not only from the Muslim community but Americans of all backgrounds

and persuasion came to answer the question: Is the future promised for a chosen few or for all? Advocacy, solidarity, dialogue, and facts against hatred and injustice are essential tools for each person to meet this challenge. Such pivotal moments call us to protect our nation's values, to uphold civil and human rights. CAIR-Chicago will continue to meet this challenge alongside all who truly seek harmony and justice.





MOSQUE & COMMUNITY OUTREACH

CAIR-Chicago staff delivered Friday sermons (khutbahs) at some of the largest mosques in the city and state in an effort to promote key civic and humanitarian ideals fostered in Islam's teachings, and to bridge the mosque audiences with the resources that CAIR-Chicago offers.

CAIR-Chicago hosted or co-sponsored several events revealing the year's most discussed sociopolitical issues, as well as forming stronger bonds with organizations and our communities. CAIR-Chicago came together with local groups to host an interfaith candlelight vigil for Chapel Hill massacre at Loyola School of Law. In an effort to understand the psychology behind mosque controversies, the office partnered with Silk Road Rising to host screening and discussion of *Mosque Alert* for the third straight year.

Ramadan 2015 provided several key events to address awareness and solidarity. For the seventh consecutive year, the annual Taste of Ramadan Iftar & Cook-off welcomed 200 community members and supporters in another record number of dishes, desserts and beverages reflecting cuisines from around the world.



CAIR-Chicago joined the Japanese-American Citizens League for a month-long youth program called Bridging Communities that brought together Japanese, Muslim, and other American youth to study the similar experiences of post 9/11 Muslim communities and WWII Japanese American communities. The group had the pleasure of visiting Rohwer Internment Camp and other historic civil rights sites in Arkansas.

PUBLIC EDUCATION & ACADEMIA

CAIR-Chicago staff members from all departments were invited to speak at or host groups at prominent educational institutions that included Carthage College (WI), Columbia College, DePaul College Prep (formerly Gordon Tech), DePaul University, Governors State University, Harold Washington College, Indiana University–Bloomington, Lake Forest College, Loyola University Chicago, Northwestern University, Purdue University, Saint Xavier University (SXU), Stevenson High School, Truman College, the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC), the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, Westwood College, Wheaton College, Wilmington College (OH) and Wright College.

The topics ranged from basic educational seminars to more nuanced issues such as Muslim demographics and current sociopolitical issues in the U.S., curtailing law enforcement abuses, and identity politics.

Of special note, two staff members were honored with invitations to deliver the keynote commencement address for graduating classes: Outreach Coordinator Gerald Hankerson at Aldridge Elementary School in Chicago, and Executive Director Ahmed Rehab at College Preparatory School of America (CPSA) in Lombard.

For years, interns from all departments—with diverse backgrounds, interests and perspectives—have contributed to CAIR-Chicago's broader advocacy and awareness efforts. INTERNSHIP & VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS

CAIR-Chicago is indebted to the interns and volunteer activists (VAs) who assist our staff to empower, mobilize, and engage our communities.

In 2015, the coveted program marked its 10th anniversary of developing young activists and professionals in the areas of civil rights, media, civic engagement, community outreach and research. Between 2005 and 2014, CAIR-Chicago graduated a combined 589 internships, externships and volunteering tenures.

Last year, the office graduated 42 interns, externs and fellows, along with 14 volunteer activists, from across the United States, Australia, China, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, and the United Kingdom.

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

Since 2011, the Outreach department has led civic engagement efforts in order to educate and mobilize community members to respond appropriately to policies that affects all Americans.

For the first time in the chapter's history, the Outreach department published voter education guides, as well as a legislative scorecard and referendum guide, for the Chicago municipal elections. In addition, CAIR-Chicago joined AAAJ and local advocacy groups to sponsor a Chicago mayoral candidate forum held at Northeastern Illinois University.

Ensuring that more people have a stake in democracy and access to the polls, CAIR-Chicago continued its support for recruiting college students to serve as election judges, poll watching and exit surveyors, an effort shared with over two dozen organizations. In the fall of 2015, a study published shared that this group's efforts significantly boosted voter turnout, especially in areas that traditionally had very low numbers. Lastly, CAIR-Chicago supported efforts to recruit students as election judges, as well as register voters.

CAIR-Chicago renewed its call for Illinois congressional members to support legislation that would reinforce civil liberties. Hankerson and members of Government

Affairs met with Congress woman Jan Schakowsky and Congressman Mike Quigley's senior staff to discuss maintaining strong ties with their Muslim constituents. The office joined the Illinois Coalition to Protect Academic Freedom and Free Speech and mobilized community members to voice their concerns for proposed state legislation (then later a resolution) that would penalize state universities and colleges for institutional boycotts against sovereign nations (IL SB 3017). Finally, the office joined local coalition efforts that would ensure fair, nonpartisan redistricting that would take into account every Illinois community.

For 2015, Outreach sought the positions and pledges from elected federal, state and local officials to act on the following issues:

- Action Alert: Testify Online against IL Anti-Boycott Bill—This bill infringes on the First Amendment rights companies have to protest human rights and international law violations through Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions.
- Action Alert: Demand a Stop to the Politicizing of Our Pension System to punish free speech
- Action Alert: Urge Congress to Pass Amendments Asking to Evacuate U.S. Citizens from Yemen, Close Prison at Guantanamo Bay
- CAIR-Chicago Commends Illinois in Establishing Malcolm X Day

INTERFAITH ENGAGEMENT

The Outreach department continues to hold educational lectures, workshops and dialogues. Often, Outreach works in interfaith partnerships to engage community members.

Much connection between interfaith and social justice has always been featured in CAIR-Chicago's efforts. Through its partnership with the interfaith labor rights group Arise Chicago, CAIR-Chicago stood in support of workers' rights that reflect local and national fronts. We stood in solidarity with the ongoing "Fight for 15" movement, brought hundreds of workers and their supporters to the world headquarters of McDonald's in Oak Brook, and joined strikers of the Golan Moving & Storage, Inc. and faith leaders in Skokie—Hankerson spoke how justice transcends differences and moves us to become united.

The Outreach Department also connected with local partners to infuse dialogue amid new tests to halt progress with interfaith efforts local and abroad. Along with JCUA, Outreach coordinated an event tied to the Chicago Community Trust's "On the Table 2015" initiative to assess how the local Muslim and Jewish community can continue to forge genuine interfaith cooperation. The two organizations joined together with American Islamic College to host the inaugural "Hanukkah at the Mosque" gathering. Finally, our longtime partners Catholic Theological Union's Peacebuilders Initiative brought high school upperclassmen of the Abrahamic traditions for dialogue and interactive workshops on the topic of "the stranger", where Outreach Coordinator Gerald Hankerson spoke on the panel giving the Muslim perspective.

Finally, the Outreach department advised a Wheaton College political science professor, Dr. Larycia Hawkins, on her desire to wear the hijab in solidarity with Muslim women and girls who've faced Islamophobia.

MEDIA COMMUNICATIONS & OUTREACH

The CAIR-Chicago Communications Department ensures that Muslim perspectives and concerns on vital issues and incidents are taken into account in mainstream media. Both nationally and locally, the department achieves this goal with timely press conferences and releases, and media advisories.

As a result of CAIR-Chicago's dedicated staff, and its fine record and reputation with media outlets, the chapter is often approached by producers and journalists seeking to provide well-informed coverage of issues related to Islamophobia. As media activists, our staff brought a lucid voice to the public conversation on issues making headlines including the Chapel Hill shootings, the "clock boy" story, the San Bernardino shootings, the string of anti-Muslim harassment at airport gates, the anti-Muslim polemics emanating out of the presidential primaries, and more.

2015 saw the Communications Department rise to meet the growing challenges of a demanding year. Islamophobia has risen to the mainstream this year, lifted by outrageous national figures like Bill Maher, Ben Carson, and Donald Trump. CAIR-Chicago's Communication Department has been a key figure in pushing back locally and nationally. We have innovated the fight against bigotry. After Islamophobes like Pamela Gellar used cartoons as a vehicle for hate to lash out against us in the guise of free speech, the department founded the first Political Cartooning Internship of its kind to push back. When Ahmed Mohamed was arrested for bringing a homemade clock to school our viral response was featured on CNN, MSNBC, RT and dozens of other outlets. Over the summer a BuzzFeed guiz created by the Department, comparing similarities between teachings of the Quran and Bible received well over 50,000 views. We are proud to gain traction in these new media frontiers and look forward to utilizing tomorrow's tech tools to continue this important work.

As the primary means of contact and updates with the communities we support, our Department has placed special emphasis this year on redesigning CAIR-Chicago's website and eNewsletter, the Chicago Activist. Both platforms are now successfully launched with responsive new layouts that make it easier for the public to get the information they need when they need it on a computer, smart phone, or other device.

This is all made possible by the Department's relationships with the Chicagoland community broadly, and the students groups, bloggers, and cultural institutions that it is composed of. These community members share our goal of empowering cross-cultural understanding, and using media activism as a medium to affect change.

ONLINE ACTIVISM

In an increasingly digital, connected world, news breaks locally, nationally, and globally simultaneously. The Communications Department is always prepared for what's coming next -- whether that means viral stories, or social media campaigns. This year the department also launched its cartooning internship, which proved to be an effective new tool for combating Islamophobes. In November one of our cartoons went viral during a wave of the xenophobic comments by Republican presidential candidates and governors, tackling the ridiculous and rampant fear-mongering that became a hallmark of the GOP presidential race.


The Department ensures that CAIR-Chicago is always engaged in the conversation through its social media accounts on Twitter, Facebook, and Youtube. Always up to date and accessible to the community, the important web-presence makes sure that community members are always in the loop, able to get in touch quickly, and able report Islamophobia in real time.

CHICAGOMONITOR

The Chicago Monitor was founded in 2012 by CAIR Chicago Executive Director Ahmed Rehab to offer a platform for activists to produce works that challenge mainstream media coverage by providing alternative perspectives on social justice as well as civil and human rights issues. The Chicago Monitor writers include CAIR Chicago staff, interns, and volunteers from around the world and the site has attracted thousands of international and local visitors.

This year The Chicago Monitor more thoroughly covered important Chicago stories including the yearlong fight for community control of the Chicago Police Department; the impact of budget cuts on mental health services, homelessness, and education; epidemic of gun violence; and the challenges to Mayor Rahm Emanuel's administration. The Chicago Monitor was the first local news service to call for the Mayor's resignation in an editorial. Multiple international stories were covered in depth including the war in Yemen; struggles of the Syrian refugees; nuclear talks with Iran; elections in Israel; plight of the Rohingya in Burma; and the issues of Indian Muslims. Topics related to Palestine continued to be reported including the sentencing and appeal of Palestinian community leader Rasmea Odeh; the national campaign against detention of Palestinian children; local Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions (BDS) campaigns; and the struggle of the people in Gaza. On the national level, the local impact of the Black Lives Matter movement and its intersection with reform of the criminal justice system had ongoing coverage. The Chicago Monitor ran a series called "Policing the Politicians" that provided a guide to the positions of the Democratic and Republican candidates for president on Immigration, combating ISIS, the Charleston killings, and attitude toward Islam and Islamophobia. A number of issues of significance to the Muslim community were treated including the growth of Islamophobia during 2015; treatment of mental health issues; challenging abuse within the community; and the successful campaign to designate May 19 as Malcolm X Day in Illinois.

For all of these important events of 2015, The Chicago Monitor not only responded, but delivered new insights into the human rights aspects and community impact of these stories. While CAIR-Chicago aims to fight bigotry, promote tolerance, and defend civil rights, the Chicago Monitor echoes these principles not only by giving voice to new and unique perspectives on critical issues, but also by inspiring activists to participate in social justice and human rights campaigns.

The Chicago Monitor covered national and local events including a large solidarity rally in Evanston, Ill., attended by hundreds including the suburb's mayor and Northwestern University's president Morton Schapiro.

Many major stories were followed throughout the year including the Black Lives Matter movement, police crimes in Chicago, mental health services and education in Chicago, Syrian refugees, and the impact of the war in Yemen on the local Yemeni community.

This year we published 160 articles, an increase of 30 over 2014 and featured over 50 individual contributors with almost half outside our staff. In 2015, we added an editorial cartoonist who was able to effectively lampoon many of the figures in the news, especially Donald Trump. Going forward, we have obtained press credentials from the Chicago Police Department to improve our access to Chicago breaking news. From our coverage of important community stories, to media analysis of news not covered elsewhere, and ongoing reporting on important stories, we have continued to expand the scope of our news analysis, our original reporting, and the diversity of our audience."




